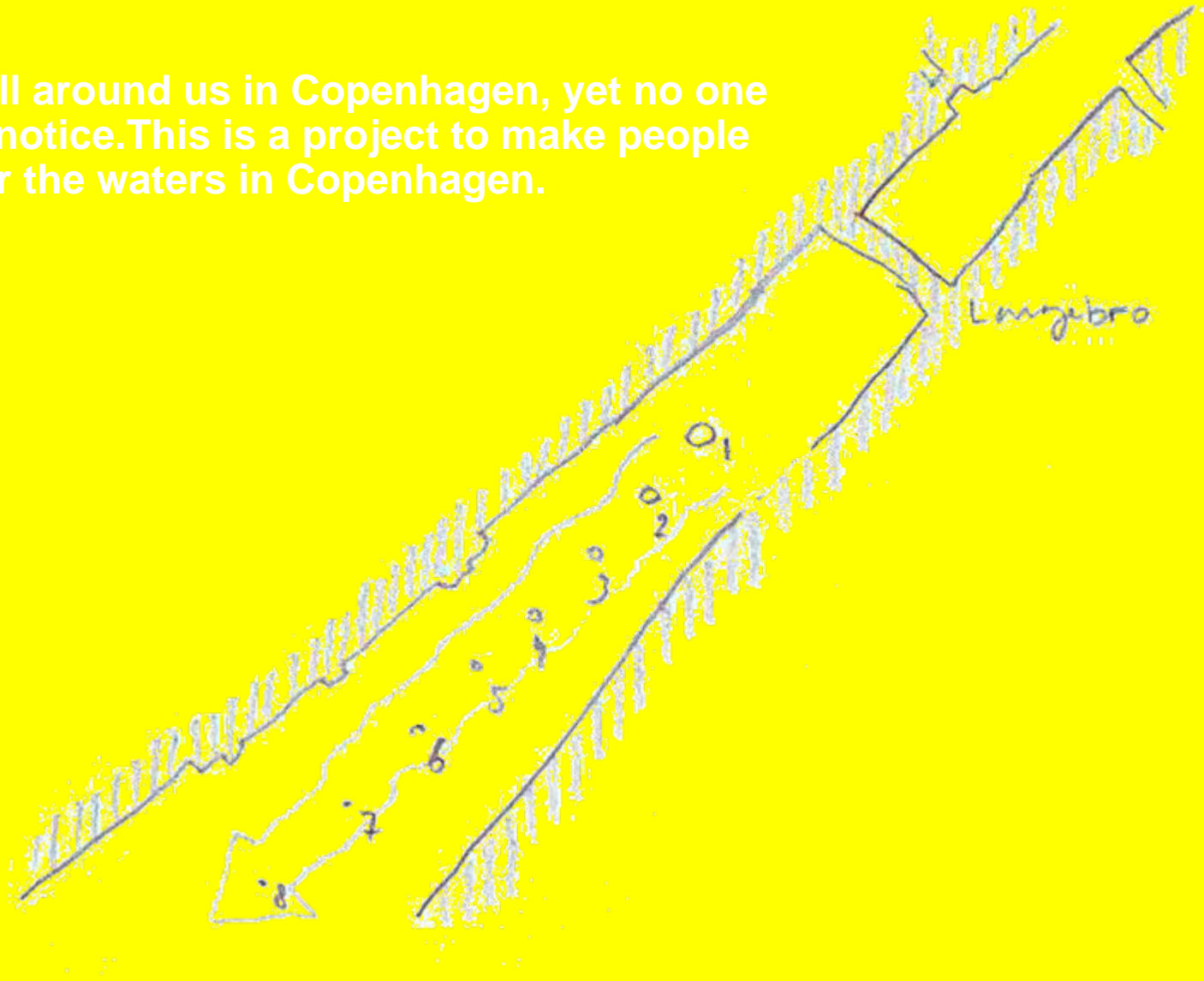


MOVING WATER

Water is all around us in Copenhagen, yet no one seems to notice. This is a project to make people rediscover the waters in Copenhagen.
